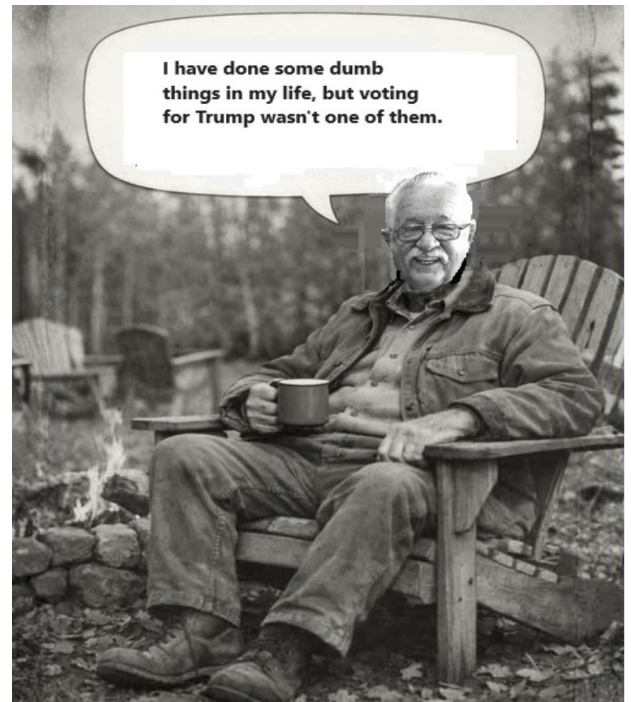

## President's Message – May—2026

I love Spring on the Central Coast! It is my favorite time of year. The flowers are blooming, the grass is green (for a while) and best of all, Easter has come. Celebrating the Resurrection of our Lord is a joy and I hope you all had a wonderful Easter day.

I wanted to share with you two things this month. The first is a book I recently read called **Irreversible Damage** by Abigail Shrier. She has been on Fox quite a bit for her research regarding girls and transgenderism. If you have ever wondered why there is such an increase in the issue of girls thinking they are boys, this book provides many answers. One answer, in particular, was appalling to me. The American Medical Association; the American College of Physicians; the American Academy of Pediatrics; the American Psychological Association; and the Pediatric Endocrine Society have all endorsed “general affirming care” as the standard for treating patients who self-identify as “transgender” or self-diagnose as “gender dysphoric.” “As the World Professional Association for Transgender Health standards advise “health professionals can assist dysphoric individuals with affirming their gender identity, exploring different options for expressing that identity and making decisions about medical treatment options for alleviating dysphoria.” Ms. Shrier notes—“Notice whose medical judgment is in the driver’s seat. Hint: It isn’t the doctor’s.”

There is no other issue in medicine where the patient decides the diagnosis and the physician immediately goes along with it. Yet this harmful practice has resulted in many girls being started on cross sex hormones, gender reassignment surgeries and removal of breasts. Ms. Shrier points out that statistics show that 70% of girls who openly express the idea that they are boys, ultimately decide that they are, indeed, girls. Their concerns are normal and are typically caused by their discomfort with their changing bodies. I felt enlightened by Ms. Shrier’s book and I hope you will be as well.

I also wanted to recommend the film the Great Awakening to you. I originally went into this film thinking it was about the struggle for our founders to write the Constitution, but that is not the case, although the Constitution plays a role. The film highlights how English pastor George Whitefield’s religious revival sermons sparked a spiritual movement, uniting the American colonies and influencing the ideological foundation of the American Revolution. It is well worth seeing.

In the meantime, my friends, stay strong, pray for our Troops and our President and keep whacking those weeds.

## **SPEAKER FOR APRIL WAS *Vanessa Rozo*:**

Our speaker for our April 28, 2026, General Meeting was Vanessa Rozo a candidate for San Luis Obispo County Clerk Recorder.

Vanessa and her husband Mike have lived in San Luis Obispo County for 35 years where they raised their two sons. They currently reside in Grover Beach and operate their own business, N-Hance Wood Refinishing, Inc. in Oceano serving the Central Coast and Central Valley.

Vanessa asked and answered why she is running for County Clerk-Recorder. Vanessa is skilled in high level leadership and organization. She shared with us that she is not a policy person or very political. When she is out working on national and international disaster relief, she works beside government not for government. She wants to take care of the people that come through her door.

Vanessa has studied law. She is a paralegal writing wills and trusts. She is also an estate liquidator. These are just some of the things that she does, these are her skill sets that she has been doing for the past 21 years.

Vanessa told us that this County Clerk-Recorders office best fits her resume, because she is highly organized and has a high level of leadership. She knows how to work with government and work with the citizens to get them the resources they need. She feels the County Clerk-Recorders office is a resource that we need to vote to be well established and represented with transparency, accuracy and efficiency. This is what she will bring to this office.

Vanessa said that her dedication to public service is her passion to make in difference in San Luis Obispo County. She feels the demands of the office of Clerk-Recorder are professionalism and deep respect for due process. She told why due process is so important. Because we are working with legal documents such as birth certificates, death certificates, marriage licenses, titles to property and they need to be managed well and accessible to us at any time because they are our vital records.

Vanessa believes the election process needs to be a well-oiled machine. She informed us that she likes to study the law and that elections are governed by law and not by policy. Vanessa elaborated further telling us that she worked the Maui fires where she was able to fund every funeral that occurred because of those fires. She said she learned that she had to listen to every person's story, what they really needed and to her that was the biggest skill set that she learned. This is what she will bring to the County Clerk-Recorders office. She says it is compelling to listen to the constituents of San Luis Obispo County regarding the current County Clerk-Recorder and past Clerk-Recorders.

Another fact Vanessa told us about herself is that she can multi-task at all times. When she multitasks, she does so with research. So, she does not go on opinion, she goes on facts. If you bring anything to her, she wants the facts behind it and show her what is behind it and who is affected by it so that she will be able to help mitigate it and get it resolved.

Vanessa stated that she is stepping up to do her civic duty to serve the community for the people of San Luis Obispo County. She will bring a level of professionalism to the office with integrity, serving everyone who walks through the County Clerk-Recorder's doors.

Vanessa informed us that mail in ballots is only an emergency proclamation that was brought on by COVID. Mail in ballots are not mandated and that we can actually go back to precinct ballots and absentee ballots. The machines are a different story. It is law that they must be used in our elections. We cannot hand count ballots. The only ones who have access to those machines and what's inside them are the Secretary of State and the County Clerk-Recorder.

Vanessa supports a Vote Center. She explained that you can go anywhere in the county and vote by signing an electronic signature and poll pad where your ballot will be printed right there and you can go into a booth and vote and turn your ballot in just like in person voting at your precinct. She pointed out the fact that only 2 hands at this point touched that ballot. Less opportunities for fraud.

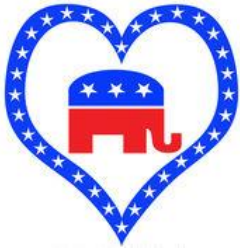
ARWF bucket donations for April totaled \$214.31. The donation will be going to Tree of Life, as well as donations that we collect in May and June.

Bonnie Alvarado from faith-based Tree of Life will be at the next general meeting in May to briefly share the services TOL offers our community.

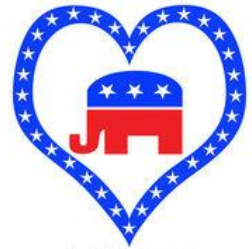
