

President's Message - May -2024

Dear Members and Fellow Patriots



She is so thankful for the many friends, family, and the community for their help.









SPEAKER FOR MAY WILL BE SHERI HAVER:

Sheri will be talking about how the Alliance, intends to provide information on proposed projects so the public can make informed decisions and advocate for the best solutions to our energy needs. Their mission is to protect California's Central Coasts from the destructive impacts of offshore wind energy development. They seek to educate the public, advocate for informed decision-making, mobilize the community, collaborate with governing officials, and pursue legal action when necessary.

SPEAKER FOR APRIL WAS NINA SPINELLO:

Nina Spinello was our speaker on April 23, 2024. She is a student at Cuesta College, hoping to transfer to Cal Poly in the fall. Nina is the President of Turning Point U.S.A. San Luis Obispo County Activism Hub. She works alongside the Cal Poly Turning Point presidents, Madison and Josh. Nina is a local who has lived here since the eighth grade. She went to Templeton High School. While there she was the alternative student representative on the school board. Nina said her mother and father raised her with very astute values! Those values shined through as she talked with us!

After graduating from high school in 2018, she went to Sarah Lawrence College, an east coast liberal arts private school. Nina joked that Sarah Lawrence, a sister school which originally allowed women to attend the Ivy system, is no longer all women – it's 30% women and 70% they/thems! In 2020, Nina decided she didn't want to go there any longer.

Nina talked about Turning Point U.S.A. It is a non profit, educational organization. It is run by Charlie Kirk, a well known, God-driven conservative who has a podcast, among many other platforms which are primarily geared toward educating young students interested in conservative issues. Turning Point's goal is to empower informed civic and cultural engagement that is grounded in American exceptionalism and positive spirit of action. Nina said that in a world where so many young people are being swallowed by corrupt agendas and misinformation, Turning Point acts as a beacon of light amidst the storm. It offers students a sense of community, a community that is built on free markets, the importance of freedom, and limited government. Most of all, at the core of everything Charlie Kirk and Turning Point stand for is love and worship of God.

Nina offered a valuable glimpse into her world as a student navigating the system of higher education. She has had first-hand experience dealing with corrupt professors who were set on indoctrinating their students, but she said that has not been her experience at Cuesta College. Cuesta is so much better than the education she was getting at the college back east. It is not perfect, because nothing is, but she has been able to maintain her conservative values while pursuing her degree at Cuesta.

The Cuesta and Cal Poly Turning Point chapters work closely together to organize social and political events for students on both campuses. Cal Poly went from 5 members last year to 30 members this year! What put Cal Poly on the road to Turning Point was an event called "A De-transitioner and Dad Speak on the Transgender Ideology Movement." Chloe Cole, who is an 18 year old de-transitioner, talked about how, at 15, she underwent a double mastectomy, was on all the puberty blockers and all the hormone treatments. At 17 she realized it was all a mistake. The dad was Billboard Chris, who is very active in the movement against the trans ideology. The event caused a HUGE controversy. There were over 400 protestors who came to stand against Chloe Cole. Nina was moved by Chloe's story, and when she saw the protestors stand so passionately against Chloe, Nina decided that joining Turning Point would be the best way to fight against protestors like this!

The event received national recognition, and this led to Nina and other Turning Point members hosting an event where Charlie Kirk came to Cal Poly to do one of his "Prove Me Wrong" tables.

Charlie Kirk likes to come to college campuses, set up a table with a microphone, and ask students to challenge him. He says, "You disagree with me? Let's talk about it!" The Cal Poly event was one of the largest turnouts that Charlie Kirk has ever had at a Prove Me Wrong" table event! It broke records. Over 700 students attended. At one point the crowd broke into an impromptu singing of the National Anthem, which drowned out the chants of the few protestors who were there. Ironically, the protestors hid behind masks, hoods, sunglasses, signs, banners, and umbrellas and they didn't want to talk to Charlie about their disagreements even though they had every opportunity to do so.

Nina brought us proof that although some places in this country are perhaps too far gone, San Luis Obispo is not. She said college is a blessing. Students' principles and pride get tested. Students' minds are enriched while debating openly. Sometimes, in order to avoid indoctrination, students must develop critical thinking skills, which is a good thing! Turning point has given Nina hope because other

students at her school share her ideas. With Turning point she is not alone.

Nina is planning an upcoming event. It will be a Q and A panel about the wind farm in Morro Bay. Speakers from both sides of the debate will present their sides. Nina will ask questions, and the audience can ask questions too. This will take place at 6 pm either on Monday May 6, or Tuesday, May 7. When the date is set, Nina will get the information to headquarters. Also, there will be emails and a radio announcement to let the public know. It was great to hear from such a dynamic, hard working, personable young leader!

2024 Caring For America

The month of April we collected an amazing \$1000.00. In the month of May, the ARWF will continue to support and bless Kyndal Gottfried a second grader that attends Monterey Road elementary School and lives in Atascadero. Kyndal has been battling Medulloblastoma for three years, and she and her mother have been flying to Georgia for her clinical trials for the past year. Her mother, Raquel, is a single mother and Atascadero native who is manager at the Atascadero In-N-Out. She graduated from Atascadero High School in 2005.

Kyndal's cancer journey began with treatment in 2021 at the Children's Hospital in Houston. After a year of treatment, they were ecstatic with the news of her remission. Unfortunately, a few months later, her cancer returned. After Kyndal was diagnosed again, she began treatment at the Children's Hospital of Los Angeles.

When the treatment was deemed unsuccessful, Raquel cast a wide net to find a clinical trial that would work for Kyndal's specific cancer. That is where they found a clinical trial in Augusta, Georgia. They have organized two fundraisers and spread the word via newspapers and KSBY news. They feel incredibly grateful for the outpouring of love and support both emotionally and financially from this community, however the travel costs have been more costly than expected.


